3. In the garden to remember, who was Moignard's friends?

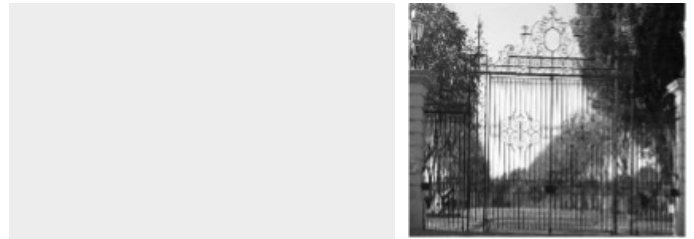
4. Where would you find Clayden, Langois, Rondel and Vibert?
